EU Youth Dialogue – Youth Delegates

The Jugendrot and the Ministry of Education, Children and Youth are looking for 2 young delegates to represent the voice of Luxembourg youth in the framework of the EU youth dialogue from July 2026 until December 2027.

WHAT IS THE EU YOUTH DIALOGUE?

The EU Youth Dialogue is a process that brings young people and decision-makers together. It aims to ensure that young people have a real say in the decisions that affect them. Through this dialogue, the views, needs and ideas of young people and youth organisations are taken into account in the development of youth policies at EU level. The EU Youth Dialogue is part of the EU Youth Strategy, which is proposed by the European Commission and sets the overall framework for cooperation on youth issues in the European Union.

The process is organised in 18-month work cycles. Each cycle focuses on a specific theme, based on the **European Youth Goals (YG)**, which were defined by young people themselves. For each cycle, one priority theme is selected by the Trio Presidency of the Council of the EU. This cycle the Trio Presidency consists of Ireland, Lithuania, and Greece. The 12th cycle of the EUYD will focus on **YG 4 – Information and constructive Dialogue** - Ensure young people have better access to reliable information, support their ability to evaluate information critically and engage in participatory and constructive dialogue. The success of EU Youth Dialogue depends on the direct involvement of young people and youth organisations.

Each Presidency will hold an **EU Youth Conference** in their country. They are key events within the EU Youth Dialogue, bringing together young people, policymakers, and experts from across Europe. They give young people a platform to share ideas and recommendations on the current topic of the cycle. Participants include youth delegates, governments, and organizations. Their outcomes influence EU policies and initiatives such as the EU Youth Strategy 2019–2027, strengthening youth participation in European decision-making.

During each cycle, every EU country conducts a **national consultation** of young people, policymakers, youth organisations, and YOU! At national level, the process is coordinated by the National Working Group (NWG). The NWG is a national group mandated by the Ministry of Education, Children and Youth and coordinated by the National Youth Council (Jugendrot). It brings together key actors from the youth sector to support and implement the EU Youth Dialogue in the country.

WHAT IS THE ROLE OF THE EU YOUTH DELEGATES?

EU Youth Delegates represent the voice of young people and contribute to the EU Youth Dialogue at both European and national level.

Their role includes :

- Interest in taking an active role in promoting and implementing the EU Youth Dialogue and the Youth Goals in Luxembourg under the supervision of the Jugendrot and in collaboration with the National Working Group
- Taking part in the onboarding phase:
 - Briefing EU Youth Dialogue, with You! – July 4th 10h00 until 12h00

- Organize and conduct an institutional consultation phase to meet national experts related to the EU Youth Dialogue
- Attend every National Working Group meeting
- Contribute to the organisation and implementation- in close collaboration with the NYC Luxembourg and the NWG - a national consultation phase with young people throughout the country to better represent Luxembourg's youth (minimum of four different events/activities between August 2026 and January 2027) on this cycle's topic
- Be available for the preparation of the EU Youth conferences on demand of the MENJE
- Participating in EU Youth Conferences, contributing to discussions with decision-makers and representing the views of young people, based on national consultations
 - EUYC - European Youth Conference, Ireland – September 27th until September 30th, 2026
 - EUYC - European Youth Conference, Lithuania – Approx. March 2027
 - EUYC – European Youth Conference, Greece – Approx. September/October 2027
- Provide regular feedback on the progress of the consultation project and all the activities of the mandate to the coordinator and to the NWG
- Drafting of an activity report on commitments undertaken (due December 2026 and December 2027)
- Promoting the EU Youth Dialogue and raising awareness among their peers (including at least two activities), sharing outcomes from European discussions at local, regional and national level, and contributing to communication activities — including the development, implementation and evaluation of a social media communication plan
- Supporting continuity by sharing their experience with future delegates

PROFILE

- Age between 18 and 30
- Have their residence in Luxembourg and be present in Luxembourg on a regular and continuous basis to complete the consultation phase
- Very good English skills (written and spoken)
- Fluency in speaking and writing in Luxembourg's official languages (Luxembourgish, German, French)
- Work/volunteer experience with young people and representation and mobilization of young people
- No active involvement in a political party, nor hold any political office and/or mandate during the entire period of the youth delegate's mandate

HOW TO APPLY

- Submit a **CV in French**.
- Submit a written document (1 page) describing a **concrete idea for the consultation phase in Luxembourg (in English)** explaining:
 - Briefly present your first idea for a youth consultation (on- or offline) activity in Luxembourg. What is the theme of this consultation event? Who is it aimed at? How is the activity structured? What are the different steps for implementing this activity/event (planning and timeline)?
- Send a **video (maximum 3 minutes, in Luxembourgish)** presenting:
 - Who you are (briefly present yourself)
 - What motivates you to participate in the **EU Youth Dialogue** and why you would like to become an **EU Youth Delegate**
 - Your experience representing the voices of other young people
 - How you will address the topic of this cycle: Youth Goal No. 4
 - What does it mean for you
 - Your ideas on how to collect the opinion of young people on this topic
 - How you will disseminate the result of this cycle and sensitize your peers on this topic
- Your application will have to be submitted via our digital form (see below)

Deadline: Please submit your application until **Sunday, June 7th 2026 at 23h59**. If necessary, individual interviews (online) will be conducted during the week of June 15th, 2026.

Selection takes place until Monday, June 22nd 2026, the candidates will receive a notification via E-mail. **Please note that any application that is incomplete or does not comply with the criteria/instructions given can and will not be taken into consideration.**
